Workers at Rocky Mount Undergarment are fighting to build a union at their plant with the International Ladies And Garment Workers Union (ILGWU). They want higher wages, better benefits, a say in their working conditions, and a contract. Recently, about 60 percent of the Undergarment workers participated in a pre-union election poll outside of their plant. Over 90 percent voted in favor of having a union at their plant. Management should be fair to the workers by immediately recognizing the union and bargaining in good faith! All working people in the Rocky Mount area should support and encourage the Undergarment workers! Workers Want Fairness!

Rocky Mount City Workers

City workers say city management is unfair to the workers. Although many workers have received good job performance appraisals, they have not received the promised bonus or pay increases that are supposed to come with a good evaluation.
